INVERELL SOLDIER KILLED IN

INVERELL, Tuesday.

Word has been received by Mr. Robert Brown, of Nulimmunna, that his son, Private E. Brown, had died in France, on the 4th instant, as the result of gunshot wounds in the right leg and back.

The deceased soldier left Australia about 18 months ago, and was wounded some few months ago. Another brother is also present at the front.
