## **RECORD OF SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENT**

The NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) issues the Record of School Achievement (RoSA) to eligible students who leave school before completing the Higher School Certificate (HSC). The RoSA is a cumulative credential, meaning it contains a student's record of academic achievement up until the date they leave school. This could be between the end of Year 10 up until and including some results from Year 12. The RoSA records completed Stage 5 (Year 10) and Preliminary Stage 6 (Year 11) courses and grades, HSC (Year 12) results, and where applicable participation in any uncompleted Preliminary Stage 6 courses or HSC courses.

The RoSA is useful to students leaving school prior to the HSC because they can show it to potential employers or places of further learning.

The RoSA is also available to students who, from 2020, have not demonstrated the HSC minimum standard to receive their HSC.

You need reading, writing and maths skills to be successful in everyday life after school.

That's why you're required to show a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy to receive the Higher School Certificate (HSC) from 2020.

You get two chances a year to pass each of the tests from Year 10 until a few years after the HSC.

If you pass the online tests of basic reading, writing and numeracy skills you will show you've met the HSC minimum standard.

-I will complete the HSC in 2019: You do not need to meet the HSC minimum standard or pass the online tests to receive the HSC.

-I will complete the HSC in 2020: You need to meet the HSC minimum standard to receive the HSC.

To show you meet the standard you need to:

■pass the online reading test or have achieved Band 8 or above in reading in Year 9 NAPLAN in 2017 and

■pass the online writing test or have achieved Band 8 or above in writing in Year 9 NAPLAN in 2017 and

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■pass the online numeracy test or have achieved Band 8 or above in numeracy in Year 9 NAPLAN in 2017.

-I will complete the HSC in 2021 or later

You need to meet the HSC minimum standard to receive the HSC.

The standard is set at level 3 of the Australian Core Skills Framework (ACSF), which means students will have the basic reading, writing and maths skills needed for everyday tasks and future learning after school.
