EDWIN (Ted) Akhurst was born in Inverell, the second child of Edwin and Dorothy Akhurst.

Ted had two brothers and four sisters. Two sisters survive - Nance Steiger from Inverell and Dorothy Baker from Dungog. He was educated at Gum Flat and

Inverell.

Ted enjoyed his sport, playing crick-et and tennis, he often talked about clean bowling Don Bradman in a game of cricket at Gum Flat School,

country twice in New Guinea learning his trade as a mechanic.

After working as foreman mechanic for Ashford Shire, Ted grew tobacco on "Beltana" with his brother Fred.

He then purchased Severn Motors, there with son-in-law Brian, conducted a successful business, until retiring to Hawk's Nest in 1980, keeping himself busy fishing and growing vegetables.

A quiet youth, he assisted his father with growing tobacco, rabbiting and catching fish.

In his final weeks Ted was cared for by his wife before entering Buladelah nursing home ten days before his passing.
