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From the Principal

Monday 1st August, 2022



The school has quickly and quietly resumed its daily routines with a wide range of activities underway in our learning spaces. Year 12 are in their final term of schooling before the HSC exams; last assessments underway and finalising of all marks and projects before sending to NESA. Pre-school students are participating in transition every Wednesday morning with a range of activities to prepare them for 'big school'. Later in the term Subject Selections will take place which is a particularly important event for Year 10 students. These activities really highlight the cycle of education in our school.

The Snow Excursion (Week 5) is edging ever closer and detailed information sessions have been presented to parents and students. The emphasis was on the early preparation that must be done to be ready for the trip. All the paperwork and payments are completed with a reminder that any medication details must be given to the Office staff as soon as possible. Behaviour expectations and attendance requirements have been outlined; both on the excursion and in the weeks before departure time. A panel (Principal, Head Teacher and a teacher) will be convened if any student has an incident or attendance issue of concern; as per ACS behaviour processes. Positive behaviour is 100% expected when representing our school. What an amazing opportunity to be participating in this memorable experience.

Currently Covid, Influenza A or a gastric bug have affected many in our community. It is very important that any unwell student stays at home, does a RAT and if positive notify the school and remain at home for 7 days. Test all other students in the family each day - if negative attend school and wear a mask. To support Risk Management procedures for the Snow excursion, all staff and all secondary students must wear a mask in all indoor settings for Weeks 3 & 4 (1-12th Aug). On the first day of the excursion, all attendees must take a RAT. If positive or a close contact, then it is not possible to attend the excursion. Further details will be given to students attending the excursion soon. Please take care to follow NSW Public Health guidelines and look after yourselves in these trying times.

Finally, what a generous initiative, supported by the P&C and staff, to add a jumper to our uniform for all students. Everyone will look warm and proudly display they are from our school. A reminder, when the garment is received, to please make sure the student's name is clearly labelled on the jumper in case of loss.


Why are you reading it?


I have previously read other novels by Rosalie Ham and was very interested to read 'The Year of the Farmer'.






