RECIPE OF THE WEEK

French Onion, Bacon and Cheese Cob Loaf

Ingredients

- 1 tsp olive oil
- 150g shortcut bacon rashers, finely chopped
- 1 red onion, halved, thinly sliced
- · 375g cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup (150g) mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup (60g) grated tasty cheese
- 40g pkt French onion soup mix
- 1/4 cup chopped chives
- 450g White Cob Loaf
- Chopped chives, extra, to sprinkle
- Vegetable sticks, to serve

Method

- Preheat oven to 180C. Line a baking tray with baking paper.
- Heat the oil in a medium frying pan over medium-high heat. Add the bacon and onion and cook, stirring, for 3 mins or until bacon starts to brown. Transfer to a plate lined with paper towel to drain.
- Combine the bacon mixture, cream cheese, mayonnaise, tasty cheese, soup mix and chives in a large bowl. Season.
- Use a serrated knife to cut 4cm from the top of cob loaf and reserve. Remove the bread from centre of loaf, leaving a 2cm-thick shell. Tear bread pieces into 3cm pieces. Spoon the bacon mixture into shell. Top with lid. Place on prepared tray. Arrange bread pieces around cobb. Bake for 20 mins or until golden.
- Sprinkle with extra chives. Serve with vegetable sticks.





RECIPE OF THE WEEK

CHRISTMAS TRIFLE

Ingredients

- 300 g Swiss jam roll
- 600 g vanilla custard
- · 250 ml thickened cream
- 85 g red jelly
- 60 ml Baileys Irish cream liqueur
- 1/4 cup icing sugar mixture
- 1 tsp vanilla essence
- 2 cups mixed berries to taste
- 85 g green jelly



Method

- Make the jelly as directed on the box.
- Once set, use a knife to cut the jelly into 3 cm chunks.
- Place the thickened cream into a bowl and whip until very thick.
- Beat in icing sugar and vanilla essence.
- Cut the jam roll into slices 2 cm thick and layer into a large glass bowl.
- Cover with liqueur or alcohol of choice.
- Allow to soak for 10 minutes and cover with berries.
- Dollop berries with the cream and custard.
- Add the jelly on top and then repeat the process with the cream and custard.


