#### STUDENTS BECAME AUTHORS AND ILLUSTRATORS

During term 1, year 3 to 6 students embarked on an exciting journey into the world of storytelling and illustration through a Creative Arts project, producing a book. Inspired by the rhythmic and repetitive style of There Was an Old Woman Who Swallowed a Fly by Pat Adams, each student created their very own illustrated book, showcasing both their writing and artistic talents. Throughout the project, students developed their literacy skills by crafting imaginative stories that featured repetition, rhyming words, and building narrative tension. They engaged in the full writing process—planning, drafting, editing, and refining their work—before bringing their stories to life with vibrant illustrations. In addition to being authors, students stepped into the role of illustrators. They explored a range of artistic techniques to design characters, settings, and key story elements. The result was a collection of colourful, detailed pages that visually complemented their storytelling. The project also nurtured creative and critical thinking, encouraged collaboration, and fostered problem-solving skills. Students reflected on their progress, built confidence in discussing their work, and celebrated the experience of sharing their finished books with others. Through this hands-on learning experience, students not only produced their own illustrated books but also gained valuable insight into the creative process. 
# DIGITAL NOTES



# RECIPE OF THE WEEK











#### CABBAGE MEATBALL SOUP

#### **Ingredient list:**

- 10 12 cups water
- 3 potatoes peeled and chopped (about 2 ½ cups)
- 1/2 cabbage head shredded
- ½ 1 Tablespoon butter or oil (to sauté veggies)
- 1 large onion chopped
- 2 carrots peeled and julienned or grated
- 2 celery stalks sliced
- 2-4 garlic cloves minced
- 2-3 tomatoes seeded and chopped (juice reserved)

#### Meatballs:

- 1 lb ground chicken or ground turkey, ground pork, ground beef
- 1/3 cup panko bread crumbs
- 14-1/3 cup milk just enough to cover the breadcrumbs
- 1½ Tablespoons sour cream
- 1/2 small onion grated, or finely minced and sauteed until cooked through
- 1 garlic clove optional (grated with the onion or minced) (you can use ½ teaspoon of garlic powder instead)
- 34 teaspoon salt
- 14 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1 teaspoon dry herbs and spices

#### To Serve:

- 1 Tablespoon fresh herbs minced (dill, parsley, green onions)
- Sour cream to serve with the soup, optional

#### Method:

- Prep the veggies: Shred cabbage, chop potatoes, dice onions, slice celery, cut carrots and bell peppers into matchsticks, and dice tomatoes (reserve juice).
- · Make meatballs: In a bowl, mix ground meat with meatball ingredients. Form into meatballs. (Can prep ahead or while veggies cook.)
- · Cook aromatics: Heat butter or oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add onions, carrots, and celery. Season with salt and pepper. Sauté 6-8 minutes until tender.
- 2-3 mini bell peppers or ½ of a large bell pepper, julienned Add peppers, tomatoes, and garlic: Stir in bell peppers, tomatoes (with juice), and garlic. Season and cook 5 minutes.
  - · Add water and bring to a boil: Pour in water, bring to a boil. Season broth to taste and add bay leaves (optional).
  - · Simmer potatoes: Add potatoes and simmer for 5 minutes.
  - · Add cabbage and meatballs: Stir in shredded cabbage and meatballs. Simmer 5-10 minutes until meatballs are cooked and vegetables are tender.
  - Serve: Garnish with fresh herbs (dill, parsley, or green onions). Optional: Serve with a dollop of sour cream
