



WORKSHOP 1

Raising Resilient Kids: Helping Children Manage Anxiety

WHO IS THIS FOR: Parents and caregivers of children aged 6–12

DESCRIPTION: Learn how to support your child's anxiety using practical tools drawn from Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT). This workshop explains the science behind anxiety and introduces strengths-based strategies that help children challenge unhelpful thinking and build brave behaviours.

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

WINTER DINNER IDEAS CASSEROLE

TUNA AND TOMATO PASTA CASSEROLE

Ingredient list:

- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 (28-ounce) can tomatoes, whole or crushed
- Salt
- 1 pound pasta shells
- 1/2 cup ricotta cheese
- 1 (6-ounce) can tuna packed in olive oil
- 1/4 cup fresh basil, chopped or torn
- Generous 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Method:

- Melt the butter in a medium pot on medium heat and add the can of tomatoes, including the juice.
 If you are using whole canned tomatoes (or fresh ones) crush them with your (clean) fingers as you put them in the pot. Simmer gently, partially covered, for 30 minutes.
- While the sauce is cooking, heat a large pot of well salted water to a strong boil. Add the shell pasta to the boiling water and cook at a vigorous boil, uncovered, until al dente, cooked through but still a bit firm to the bite, which is usually whatever the time specified on the pasta package minus about 2 minutes. Drain and set aside.
- Pour off the excess oil from the tuna can and stir the tuna into the tomato sauce. Add the ricotta cheese, and add salt to taste. Turn off the heat. Mix the sauce with the pasta in a large bowl. Mix in the basil.
- Pour the pasta into a 2 to 3-quart casserole dish and top with the parmesan cheese. Put under a hot broiler for 4-6 minutes, until the cheese is melted and lightly browned. Serve hot.
